Level of Presentation

•National 3, 4 or 5?

•Pupils who may not succeed at Nat 5 can complete Nat 4 assessment to use as evidence. If necessary these pupils will receive retrospective certification at Nat 4 (However, in some subjects, this might involve the completion of additional material).

•Similarly - if a pupil is unsuccessful at National 4.

Why have prelims?

- Practise under exam conditions
- Assess appropriate level of presentation Nat 3/4/5
- Progression for Coursing in S5 (suitability for courses based on prelims and other assessments)

Prelims

- Prelims over 5/6 days
- Normal classes suspended during prelims
- Held in school Games Hall
- Some pupils have Additional Assessment Arrangements
- Pupils may be timetabled for more than one subject examination per day

Prelims and Final Exams Additional Assessment Arrangements (AAA)

Assessment Arrangements The Principles

- Assessment arrangements allow candidates with an additional support need to demonstrate their attainment
- Candidates have a diverse range of needs and these need to be considered when looking at assessment arrangements
- Assessment arrangements are looked at on a subject by subject basis and there should be no assumption that the same level of support will be given for every subject
- Assessment arrangements must be a candidates normal way of learning and producing work

Identification of Candidates

- Teachers are aware of pupils with additional support needs (Support Directory)
- SFL department monitor pupils and review effectiveness of support strategies
- Subject teachers build a portfolio of evidence gathered from class work, assignments and assessments

Assessment Arrangement Process

- Subject teachers consult and liaise with SFL department
- Subject teachers discuss needs and arrangements with pupils
- Evidence should be gathered over a period of time to show ongoing need
- Evidence can be samples of class work, jotter work, class tests, assignments, assessment evidence

Assessment Arrangements Process

- SFL teacher will discuss with pupils and liaise with subject teachers
- Once arrangements have been agreed with pupils/teachers a letter will be sent home to be signed by parent/carer/pupil
- All evidence and signed letters are verified by Educational Psychologist at Verification meeting

Tracking and Reporting *Tracking and Reporting* - a key priority in our school improvement plan.

Tracking reports give a 'snapshot' of how well your child is performing in each subject.

All year groups will have 3 reports each year, each including tracking data and one Full Progress Report with teacher comments.

Deadlines - why are deadlines important?


- They are there to help you manage your workload


