## Government Update - 2<sup>nd</sup> February

We are awaiting further advice on the part time return to school on 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb for senior phase pupils who require to do essential work in school for subjects that require some form of practical assessment. The City are pursuing further advice from the government which will assist all schools in meeting this requirement.

We are hoping that we will have clarity and clear information for pupils in this category by Friday 19<sup>th</sup> Feb.

We of course await further advice on pupils in S1-3 and senior pupils doing subjects that are not deemed practical.

## **SQA Assessments**

Until definite return to school dates are given and SQA advice is issued, providing information on this area is difficult. I can provide no more than the broad information given below.

The latest information from the Government indicates that when pupils do return there will be a focus on learning and teaching including recovery work up until Easter. After Easter there will be some form of assessment in S4,5,6 subjects up until the start of June to gather assessment evidence. The form of these assessments is still unclear, but it is unlikely there will be a diet of 'normal'prelims for S5/6.

There will however be assessments, so pupils should continue to prepare on that basis.

We will hopefully get a clearer understanding of this from the next Government announcement on the 16th February. Once we have clearer guidance about what is and what isn't permissible, we will send out an assessment calendar for seniors outlining the length and type of assessment in each subject.

#### **Extended school closure**

The Scottish Government announced on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> Jan that schools would remain closed until at least the middle of February.

This will mean that on-line learning will continue up until the February half term break, Friday 5<sup>th</sup> February. By that point we should know if schools will remain closed beyond the Feb break or if they will be returning.

Our position around S5/6 prelims therefore remains unchanged. No decision on how and when they might be carried out or their complete cancellation can currently be taken. Our hope is that we can still have some sort of prelim or extended assessment diet that will provide pupils and teachers with a robust measure of attainment. If such a diet can be organised within the potential restrictions that may exist we will do it but be assured that good notice will be given to pupils. There will of course have to be other forms of assessment also to ensure all pupils have opportunities to demonstrate levels of attainment over time.

In the meantime, please do continue to engage with on-line learning as best you can and let us know if there is anything you need help with.

#### **Live Class Contact - On-line Learning**

Both teachers and pupils are continuing to develop their skills in on-line leaning strategies. Live Class Contact (LCC) is an area that all teachers are addressing with classes. This live contact may take a number of forms such as 'check-ins', tutorials, Q&As or a live lesson, whatever is most appropriate for the learning and the class at that time. We do know that having Live Class Contact is vitally important in motivating and directing pupils, but it has to complement the independent and flexible study options that many of our pupils also enjoy and for practical reasons often find easier to access

It has to remembered that both pupils and teachers may have home circumstances that would not always allow them to engage in a live class contact session.

#### **Pastoral Support for Pupils**

Pupil support leaders/guidance teachers have contacted all pupils by email and through their year group Teams to say "hello" to them all and check in. The guidance staff have shared their email addresses with all pupils and have encouraged any pupils who are struggling to make contact with them.

Hannah Masterton, our pupil support officer, has been holding regular catch ups with young people who would normally access the "Hub" in school to check in with them and has established a Teams group for additional support. The pupil support team are supporting pupils in the hub school and making contact with identified young people.

Staff across the school are monitoring pupil engagement with work and will feedback any concerns to the guidance teachers who will then make contact with home as appropriate to try and plan a way forward.

## **HUB school provision**

The HUB school for the children of key workers and vulnerable pupils is operating daily within Boroughmuir. HUBs operate for the normal school day only. Lunch is provided free of charge for pupils in attendance.

HUBs are operating on a much reduced staffing model and spaces are only available as per government guidelines i.e where both parents are key workers and no childcare is available from the wider family or community links.

The exception to this is where the school has identified pupils as vulnerable in which case the child's guidance teacher will have made contact to offer a space.

We cannot accommodate pupils out with these criteria.

#### Pupil Absence from on-line Learning.

To comply with City and government requirements for recording school attendance, can parents/carers of any pupils who are Home Learning please contact the School to inform them that their child is unable to Home Learn on a particular day. Parents should inform schools on subsequent days if their child continues to be absent from home learning (until their child can resume home learning).

#### **S2 Course Choice**

Our S2 Assembly this week highlighted the importance of engaging in all subjects equally to support course choice decisions later this term. S2 pupils will be deciding which subjects they wish to take forward as National Qualifications for S3/4 and in early February we will issue all S2 pupils with a course choice booklet and guidance on how this process will work.

Last year we did the whole process digitally and online which offers us the flexibility of doing this remotely. We will also offer a "Virtual Marketplace" later in the term which will offer information from all faculties to bring to life the details in the booklet and give a richer insight into their subjects. Skills Development Scotland schedule one-to-one meetings with every S2 pupil. We are currently in planning discussions with them as to how we can all make this happen this year. Our Pupil Support Leaders will keep in touch with their S2 classes to support the course choice process and all materials will be uploaded to the S2 Year Group Team. Ms Presly will also keep S2 up to date via assemblies on the S2 Team.

#### **Information for College Pupils**

School College Partnership and Foundation Apprenticeship courses will continue to be delivered online until further notice. Any exams which were planned to take place on campus before Monday 15 February 2021 have been postponed and will be rearranged as soon as it is safe to do so. All Schools College Partnership and FA courses will resume online from Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> (or Friday 15<sup>th</sup> if your course is normally on a Friday only) of January. You can access your course as normal via Microsoft Teams or your Moodle Account. Please ensure you are logged in and ready to start your class as 1.30pm.
