Delay to Occupation of the New School

I am writing to let you know that we have taken the decision to postpone the opening of the new Boroughmuir High School until the start of the new school year in August 2017.

I realise this is hugely disappointing news for the school community but, after reviewing the progress made over recent weeks and the new work programme put forward by the contractors O'Hare McGovern, clearly the school is still several months away from completion.

On Tuesday the Council's Chief Executive, Andrew Kerr, and I met the Chief Executive of O'Hare McGovern to highlight our concerns about the progress of the project and to seek assurance that the project will be completed within the new deadline. At our meeting we made clear our displeasure at the way the project had progressed to date and that any further delays would be unacceptable.

The contractors are now working towards a finishing date of 21 April 2017. After discussions with the Head Teacher, David Dempster, we have decided to postpone the move until after the summer holidays to avoid disruption to pupils during the run-up to the exam period in May. This will also allow opportunities for staff and student orientation visits before the end of the summer term.

This means the school will open as normal on the previously agreed exceptional closure dates (20 to 23 Dec 2016 and 10 Jan 2017). New exceptional closure dates will be

required for the summer move and the school will confirm these with parents when available.
