## **Holocaust Memorial Day**

Caitlin Conway and Martha Thomson have just taken part in a live call with Eugene Eric Murangwa, international footballer and survivor of the Rwandan genocide. Eric was spared because he was recognised as a footballer and spent two months in hiding with his team mates before being able to leave the country as a refugee. He has used sport as his way of healing and sharing his story

with the world. His message was that the young people of the world are those who have the power to make 'never again' a reality. He is passionate about education through sport and understanding history. Also in the meeting were Deans High School from Livingston, Kirkwall Grammar School and Agahozo Shalom school in Rwanda. This was an amazing opportunity and it was a truly inspiring story and a privilege to be part of this. This meeting will be made into a video as part of the Scottish National Holocaust Memorial day 2022, with the theme of ***One Day I Hope***. We will share this video with the wider community in January for Holocaust Memorial day on the 17th.

### **Tree of Knowledge 'attitudes for success' workshops**

Wednesday this week saw the culmination of five days of pupil workshops covering all S4-6 pupils, delivered by Colin from Tree of Knowledge. He led pupils through a range of tailored interactive games and activities arounds thoughts, feelings and actions, helping them see challenges as opportunities and recognising their own potential for success. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with many pupils repeating comments such as these:

*"I thought it was really interesting and helped to change my own perspective on life and things that might cause stress. It was useful with exams and university applications coming up."*

*"I really enjoyed this workshop...I feel more inspired to make step by step plans to achieve my goals, rather than just hoping / expecting the goals to happen. Thank you!"*

We have really enjoyed working with Colin and Tree of Knowledge, and have enjoyed the positive values and skills they have shared pupils.

### **Message from City of Edinburgh - City of Edinburgh Slavery and Colonialism Legacy Review – pupil and parent/carer engagement**

#### **What is the Edinburgh Slavery and Colonialism Legacy Review?**

Following the Black Lives Matter protests of summer 2020, City of Edinburgh Council agreed a set of actions to address historic racial injustice and stem modern day discrimination.

Its report stated: "Committee recognises... that cities, including Edinburgh, should acknowledge and address their roles in perpetuating racism and oppression in the past as part of the process of challenging it in the present."

One of the actions agreed was the establishment of an independent Review to consider and make recommendations on Edinburgh's slavery and colonialism legacy in the civic realm. Human rights activist Sir Geoff Palmer was appointed as Chair, and a Review Group was set up of people living and working in Edinburgh and from a range of different backgrounds to support this work.

#### **Why participate in the public consultation?**

The Review Group wants to hear from Edinburgh residents about the most constructive ways that their city could address issues of historic racial injustice and make Edinburgh a fair and welcoming place for everyone.

It is also seeking views about a selection of prominent public features including monuments, street names and buildings, which it considers illustrative of the many aspects of Edinburgh life and society shaped by the city's legacy of slavery and colonialism.

The findings from the consultation will inform the Review Group's recommendations and will feature in a report to be brought to Council committee for consideration in 2022. This will help the Council decide which actions it will progress, and what the priorities for change might be.

### **Return of Text Books – amnesty**

### **Covid – Omicron variant (LFT)**

They will ascertain close contacts and make contact with them.

Within school hours please contact the school.

If a pupil or staff member is diagnosed with the Omicron variant identified close contacts will have to take a PCR test and self-isolate for a full 10 days.

Information is continually changing and in the event of being a positive case or a close contact full up to date advice will be given at that time.

### **Covid – Lateral Flow Tests (LFT)**

All pupils and staff are being encouraged to ensure they take regular LFTs. There is an ample supply in the school office available for collection by pupils at any time. Please take a supply for the Christmas holidays!

### **Free bus travel for 5-21-year olds – Message & Survey from the Government.**

The Scottish Government will soon be launching the Free Bus Travel Scheme for young people between the ages of 5 and 21. This aims to encourage greener travel patterns, and increase opportunities for young people to engage in employment, education and social activities and not be excluded due to travel costs. Transport Scotland will monitor the scheme as it progresses to check on use and impact. The first step is to try and understand current travel patterns so that any changes after the scheme is introduced can be identified.

We would be grateful if parents/carers of younger children (i.e. those aged 5-16), or young people aged 12-21 themselves, could complete this short travel survey. The questionnaire asks about current travel behaviour, and your thoughts about bus travel generally and the free bus travel. This should take no more than 10 minutes to do.

Also, a big thanks to Elisa Jourdan and Alexandra Tunnah (both S3 students) who have been helping the candidates run their campaigns

The SYP is a youth-led, democratic organisation which aims to represent the young people of Scotland. The SYP is made up of around 166 democratically-elected representatives aged 14–25 from across Scotland. The main focus of the SYP elections this year have been the theme of ‘Bounce Back’. Specifically, how the candidates can be the voice in leading a Human Rights Based Approach to recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic. The three candidates have engaged in numerous training workshops in and out of school based on this issue. Most notably an in-school hustings, which had a high attendance amongst Boroughmuir students with standing room only, whereby in which the candidates were ‘grilled’.

Voting has been ongoing since 8<sup>th</sup> November, and the constituency Mari, Fabian and Sam are standing for Edinburgh Southern, has had an extremely positive voter turnout rate. This has been led with the candidates creating videos, generating a social media platform and great promotion in and out of school about the elections.

## **Friday 5th November 2021**

### **Prelim Assessments – S4**

The S4 prelim diet starts today. Individual prelim assessment timetables have been issued and an information letter issued to pupils.

Some key reminders:

- Pupils should arrive 15mins before the start of each assessment, bringing all pens, pencils, erasers, rulers and calculators. It is very important that pupils are not late.
- Dress code should be worn
- Mobile phones and smart watches must be switched off and are left in bags at the front of the halls and rooms.
- Daily information and updates will be posted on their Class of 2024 year group Teams page
- On the days pupils **do** have assessments they are only required to attend these (they do not need to register and do not attend normal classes).
- On days pupils **do not** have assessments they are expected to register and attend normal timetabled classes. They are encouraged to bring revision/study materials with them.
- On the days pupils have **two** assessments (morning and afternoon) they are allowed to study quietly in the school Atrium.

We wish all our S4 pupils well with their assessments.

### **Tracking Reports – S1 and S3**

The first tracking reports for S1 and S3 pupils has been issued alongside some guidance documentation for this school session.

Whilst we cannot respond to all parental queries you will have the opportunity to discuss this with class teachers during the forthcoming Parent Consultation evenings.

Please note that we have some staff absences due to Covid and other reasons. This is why there are some subjects with missing tracking data. We are aiming for these staff to issue updated tracking reports as soon as possible.

### **Dress Code**

We continue to encourage all our pupils to wear school dress code on a daily basis. We are very grateful to the majority of pupils who do adhere to our dress code and do wear it each day.

However, we are keen to see general improvements in pupil's dress code particularly around the wearing of branded jumpers, non-black footwear and jeans.

### **Boroughmuir Pipe Band at Remembrance Match, Tynecastle Stadium Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> November**

It's a great honour to have our pipe band play at the Hearts Remembrance match this Saturday. There is a long association between Boroughmuir High School and Hearts FC. In WW1 several FPs who became Hearts players lost their lives in battle and are remembered both on our school war memorial and also the Hearts FC war memorial.

The band will be playing on the plaza in front of the stadium from 1340 -1415. They will then move to the Soldier Memorial at the intersection of the Roseburn & Wheatfield stands from 1430-1445. A lone piper will then play pitch side before the match. There will also be short period of playing at the memorial at halftime.

The whole school will observe a minute's silence at 11am in memory of all those who have lost their lives in conflicts around the world.

The event starts in the City Chambers after which the 'Academic's' process up the Royal Mile to St Giles.

The City of Edinburgh Council was represented by the Lord Provost Frank Ross and other office bearing Councillors, CEO of the City of Edinburgh Andrew Kerr, the Interim Director of Education Julien Kramer as well as Headteachers and teachers and pupils from the City's schools.

Pupil Equity Funding is Government funding to ensure that all students can access all aspects of school life. It is there to support young people who may not be able to access the same opportunities due to family experience of financial difficulties. Boroughmuir's PEF list includes all students in receipt of Free School Meals, those who live in post codes within SIMD bands 1-4 (<https://www.gov.scot/collections/scottish-index-of-multiple-deprivation-2020/>), and some others, for example looked-after young people and those with experience of being in care.

This support can include help with equipment (e.g. calculator for maths), school dress code, support to access ICT and may also include financial support for attending school clubs or going on school excursions.

We recognise that recent events have led to some difficult circumstances for many families and want to encourage you to get in touch if you have relevant questions or concerns or you believe you may be eligible for this support and the school is not yet aware.

### **Covid Cases**

Cases in Boroughmuir have been rising as they are in all schools, and indeed society, across the country.

We currently have approximately 50 pupils absent due to testing positive. No staff are currently absent due to testing positive. Approximately 25 of these pupils will return to school on Monday.

Out of 1443 pupils and a staff of 150 these are relatively low numbers.

Well done to everyone for adhering to Covid mitigations and in helping keep these numbers low.

### **Covid Mitigations**

From 9 August, for under 18s, the rules changed for close contacts of a positive Covid case.

Everyone must still self-isolate in line with **NHS Inform guidelines** if they have had a positive Covid test or virus symptoms.

If you are aged between five and 18, you are a close contact if you live in the same household as a positive case, or if you have been identified by NHS Test and Protect as a close contact.

**Close contacts are not now identified from close contacts in class.**

If you are identified as a close contact from NHS Test and Protect, you have to:

- Self-isolate immediately and book a PCR test
- If the PCR test is negative and you remain without symptoms, you can end self-isolation and return to school
- If the PCR test is positive, stay in self-isolation in line with NHS guidance
- If symptoms start at any time, go back to the self-isolation stage and book a PCR test

Mitigations such as face coverings, hand sanitizing, one-way systems etc remain in place and are being observed by the vast majority of our pupils. It's important they all adhere to them. Please do ensure all pupils have their own face covering.
