










### **University Entrance**

- Scottish Universities usually require 4/5 Higher passes by the end of S5 (1st sitting)
- Additional passes at Higher in S6 may be required if minimum not met in S5
- Some Scottish Universities may set conditions on Advanced Highers if the S5 conditions are not met.
- Completion of AH is very important for those who start them as it is excellent preparation for university
- English Universities require 2 or 3 Advanced Highers in addition to 4/5 good Higher passes in S5



### Returning to school for S6

#### **S6** is:

- Another chance to get qualifications
- Broaden the learning experience by taking new subjects
- An opportunity to become an independent learner
- Develop leadership and organisational skills
- A full time commitment (part time jobs are a good thing but school needs to come first!)

#### **Course Choice Process**



### **School Entry Requirements**

- Read the Course Choice Booklet carefully
- Make sure entry requirements for courses are met
- S5 pupils are placed first



#### Course format for S6

- Minimum: 15 Hours
  Maximum: 20 hours
- 2/3 Advanced Highers (English Universities/Medicine)
- 2 Advanced Highers + 1H/N5
- 1 Advanced Higher + 2H/N5
- 3 or 4 subjects at Higher level/N5
- Repeating to upgrade...caution...check it is acceptable with universities



#### The case for Advanced Highers

AH prepare you for academic study

Research shows that students with AHs do better once they are at University

Some Scottish/all English Universities will set conditions on AH passes



# The case <u>against</u> Advanced Highers

- Highers are the entry requirements for most Scottish Universities
- Most conditionals will be on basis of Highers at Scottish Universities
- If you have not met the entry requirements from S5...do more Highers
- Advanced Highers will not get you in if you do not have the minimum entry requirements



## Case Study 1

- Melissa has the following from S5:
  - H English B
  - H Drama B
  - H History C
  - H Maths D

In S6, she plans to take: AH English, AH Drama & H Geography.

What do you think of this coursing, with regards to future university applications?



# What the university said...

Our advice would be that she take more Highers rather than AHs – a good rule of thumb is to ensure at the very least 4 (ideally 5) Highers at good grades to have a good chance of offers (although it will, of course, depend on the uni). Good to remember that many unis do not count both H and AH in a subject so, although the AH Eng and Drama could be used to upgrade the Bs in the Hs in Eng and Drama, she would still only have the potential of having three subjects at grade B or above (which would not be enough for most unis).

- H English A
- H Maths A
- H History A
- H French A
- HRMPS A

In S6, he plans to take: AH English, H Music, H Art H Economics

What do you think of this coursing, with regards to future university applications?




# What the university said...

Unless there's a reason for the three new Highers in S6 (i.e. subjects that the pupil is missing that they realise that they need for a particular course) a 5 A student taking only 1 AH (\*unless\* the school can't provide more) \*may\* look like they are not pushing themselves in preparation for uni-level study. A 5 As student should be encouraged to get AHs, if it's possible at the school. It may, actually, not make much difference in admissions – but those students should be using S6 to get prepared for that level of study to ease transition.

# Neighbourhood/College

- S6 pupils can solve clashes by going to JGHS/St Thomas of Aquin's & other neighbourhood schools
- Neighbourhood schools may offer additional courses at H & AH level
- College courses detailed in Course Choice booklet Tues/Thurs afternoon
- Please note these may involve online/remote learning for session 2022/23



#### Picking up courses

- S6 Departments will be rigorous about entry requirements – read course choice booklet
- Entry to Advanced Highers A or B in prelim or by negotiation with Curriculum Leader
- S5 will always have priority if numbers in classes are tight



#### What now?

- Do some research regarding possible careers and courses to make sure S6 is the best choice for you
- Read the course choice booklet and choose appropriate subjects
- Read the information guide on how to make online choices
- Make school choices by 25 February and if applying to college make sure you've completed your application by 18 March (and let your guidance teacher know you are applying for SCP)



#### **Post Course Choice**

- All courses require viable numbers we will confirm courses that are running asap
- Confirmation of College places in June
- Confirmation of school courses by end of June/August
- Opportunity to re-course in August
