Empowered Learning

- The Empowered Learning Project will give every young person in P6 to S6 an iPad. Shared iPads will be available for use in P1 to P5 and Early Years.
- These devices will significantly enhance the learning experience through equity of access, encouraging innovation, evoking imagination, and nurturing a love of learning.
- Our deployment date is 10th 14th October.
- What we are doing now:
 - Enhancing our WiFi network
 - Agreeing our policies and procedures to facilitate the day to day management of iPads
 - · Engaging with skills development and curriculum planning to allow pupils opportunities to use the iPad during learning and teaching activities



Applying for Post School destination

- Supported by Guidance teacher / Careers Adviser, whether applying to University, Graduate Apprenticeship, College, Modern Apprenticeship or Employment
- ► Timeline issued for all with key dates / deadlines
- ► UCAS applications first registered in PSE Application deadlines- (10th Oct / 12th Dec)
- ▶ Up to 5 university choices can be made choose at least one secure choice (somewhere that their grades already meet the typical entry requirements), and up to four others.
- ► All pupil information is on the S6 Team page under UCAS applications 2023

College Application

- Open Jan/Feb
- We encourage all S6 to apply as a first choice or a back up plan (unless they have an unconditional offer for University)
- College workshops during PSE time to support application process

Modern Apprenticeship / Employment

- ► These become available all year round
- Some apprenticeships may have a January closing date and not start until September
- Access information through signing up to Edinburgh Guarantee and Apprenticeship.scot for alerts, PSE, school website / twitter
- Support with application and CV's

Personal Statement

- All S6 will write a PS and adapt it for their chosen destination
- ▶ 4000 characters for UCAS & College
- Save as a word document and transfer onto application
- Draft PS due 12/09/2022 for early applicants /all others 31/10/2022
- Support with Personal Statements in school through PSE / Career's Adviser / UCAS personal statement tool.

Apprenticeships

There are two different types of apprenticeships:

A Modern Apprenticeship is way to learn whilst in a job.

- 1. You will be just like any other employee but you will also be working towards a qualification.
- 2. You will go to college on day release or complete the qualification in house
- 3. And you are getting paid whilst doing so.

A Graduate apprenticeship is again a way to learn whilst in a job

- 1. You will work towards a degree
- 2. You will go to university one day per week or in study blocks
- 3. You will get paid a salary

Where can I find an apprenticeship?

You could start having a look at these websites to help prepare Apprenticeships can be available all year round.

However a lot of companies will start recruiting around spring —March, April, May



Deciding on courses

Choose a subject you enjoy!

Consider your learning type and what sort of subjects you are interested in , You can start by browsing the My Career options section of my world of work which has lots of different job profiles. Don't panic if your young person is undecided!

Don't make your decision solely based on the university ranking!

Your ideal uni won't necessarily be the one at the top of a table, with the highest rank. Instead, you might want to focus on how well a uni delivers your chosen subject area, using the graduate prospects or research measures, or discover how satisfied students are with the quality of teaching they receive. If you do want to have a look at rankings you can go to The Complete university guide

Consider entry requirements, Location, funding

Even if you decide to apply for university -consider college as a back up

LEAPS Eligibility Criteria



In Group 2 schools, we support students who have the potential to achieve a minimum of 3 Highers by the time they finish school <u>and</u> match <u>one or more</u> of the following criteria:

- student who is first generation in family to apply to higher education or whose parents do not already have a degree.
- student from a low income background (for instance where a student is entitled to EMA, free meals in school, or where the family is entitled to a benefit such as Universal Credit).
- student who has spent time in care or being looked after
- student who is estranged
- student who is a young carer
- students may also be eligible based on their postcode (SIMD 20).







Course Eligibility Full Time

- Higher National Certificate (HNC)
- Higher National Diploma (HND)
- Degree
- Nursing/Midwifery/Paramedic
 Science degree
- Professional Graduate Diploma in Education (PGDE)





Tuition Fees Study in Scotland

Your fees are paid if you study in Scotland. How much we will pay your college or university are shown below:

- HNC, HND or equivalent £1,285
- Degree or PGDE £1,820
- HNC, HND or degree at a designated private college or university – £1,205

Study in the rest of the UK

A fee loan of up to £9,250 is available to students studying at a publicly funded college or university in the rest of the UK





How long will I be funded?

Learner Journey

Fees paid in each year of your course

Funding available if you complete an HN level course and then study a degree

One additional year of funding if you need to repeat a year or change course

Payments

- Fees paid in each year of your course
- First payment is a double payment
- Payment schedule will be on your Award Notice





Repayment of Loan

The Student Loans
Company (SLC) pay
and collect your loan



- You will not have to start repaying your loan until the April after you graduate or leave your course
- The SLC will expect you to repay 9% of your annual income over £25,375
- Your employer will take your repayments from your salary and these will show on your pay statement
- Interest linked to inflation

Example 1: Earn £26,000 a year and repay £4.69 a month Example 2: Earn £30,000 a year and repay £34.69 a month

How and when to apply

From April

every year, as soon as you know the course you want to study

Apply by 30th of June

to ensure you get your funding in time for the start of your course

if you don't get on the course you want, you can easily change or cancel your application through your SAAS Account
