**S3-6** <u>**BHS Duke of Edinburgh Award:**</u> The Duke of Edinburgh Award (DofE) is a long running development programme for young people aged 14-25. Through a series of increasingly challenging Awards, it encourages you to get out of your comfort zone and try new things. There is no one way to achieve your award – it's up to you – and there is loads of support available to help you progress.

Relaunching in November 2022, DofE will return to BHS as a weekly evening club and as a virtual offering. It will be open to young people of the following minimum ages... Academic year of turning **14 (likely S3) – Bronze Award** Academic year of turning **15 (likely S4) – Silver Award** From when you are **16 (likely S5) – Gold Award** 

Young people are welcome to complete the full scheme and work up through Bronze, Silver and Gold or join directly to the higher awards (subject to some requirements). Unsure about any aspect of the Award then please refer to the website or email one of the team on <u>leaders.seoag@gmail.com</u> **Costs** – every participant must pay a **one-off registration fee per Award**. This is currently **£24 for Bronze & Silver and £31 for Gold**. This gets you a welcome pack full of information
