What is EYA?

There will be a group in each constituency and a central forum consisting of young people and elected councillors

The local groups will be open to all young people (aged 11 to 25) and will be publicised widely through schools and youth groups.

As well as the MSYPs, the group will include young people from different backgrounds and with protected characteristics to ensure the widest representation

Each local group will meet at least four times per year EYA aims to be an effective forum for young people's voices to be heard on a wide range of issues, chosen by young people.

EYA, UNCRC & Article 12



As a person, we all have the rights that apply to everyone in the world. Children and young people though have other rights. These are listed in the UNCRC and will be at the heart of what EYA is.

The UNCRC was drafted in 1989 and is the most widely and rapidly ratified human rights treaty in history. UNCRC bill received Royal Assent on 16th January 2024 and is therefore now an Act, with commencement date of 16th July 2024.

Article 12, I have the right to be listened to.

EYA working group (MSYPs, local elected members)- met on the 9th June

MSYPs facilitated a session for young people and councilors from across the city

They introduced 'the right way' to the attendees. The right way is a project run by SYP which aims to support and challenge officials and decision makers to ensure young people's article 12 right is respected.




Our next steps...

What will EYA look like in each constituency?

- Your local Development Officer will work with them to set the aims and objectives of the group, protocols (safe spaces, respect etc) and their roles and responsibilities
- Each local EYA will create their own charter-this will then be the focus for the March (April?) citywide meeting as will try to merge the points to make an EYA group charter
- Each local EYA will discuss how to start a co-investigation to see what needs their area has? This will be done linked to the Participatory Democracy Certificate (PDC)
- We need: Schools and local youth groups to let young people know about the EYA and how and where to join us
