Dear Parents and Carers -

Welcome to November - or should I say Movember, as there is a Boroughmuir staff Movember Challenge now underway in school! Parent and carers may well spot evidence of this, if you have a parents evening this month. It has been a very international week at school, with visiting teachers from Germany and the Czech Republic, as well as TESOL students from Moray House. It is always fascinating looking outwards and learning about different educational approaches. Many thanks to the staff involved in organising - Ms Bloomer, Mr Alexander and Ms Stratton. The Seville trip returned last weekend after a most successful visit to that beautiful city, most ably led by Ms Kustra and Ms Gray. The school community so enjoyed welcoming our prospective new S1 pupils for next year last Friday, and sharing what is so unique about our school. Hopefully, they all left with a taste of the vibrant, inclusive and dynamic school community that we are so proud of. Mobile phone policy

The next week also provides an opportunity to check in with their knowledge and skills at this stage in the course, to help identify what the next steps in learning will be.
