Dear Parents and Carers,

The relentlessly busy term continues. I just wanted to say thank you once more for your flexibility and adaptability when the school closed last week, especially at such short notice.

It has been wonderful seeing so many parents and carers in school over the past two weeks, as we support our current S2, S4, and S5 pupils with the choices and decisions involved with their stage of education.

I experienced the joy of attending my first school Burns Supper last night, organised by the Former Pupils Association. It was a wonderful evening, celebrating Burns, filled with singing and dancing—and haggis, neeps, and tatties, of course. David Dempster delivered the toast to the lassies, and it was lovely to be able to congratulate him on his MBE in person.

The Holocaust assemblies this week have been profoundly moving, appropriately challenging, and incredibly thought-provoking. Thank you to James Crompton for supporting Bella Almehel and Mischa Sutherland in writing and delivering the assembly. These S5 pupils have been the school's ambassadors this year in the Lessons from Auschwitz project. In addition, we had a visit from Sokphal Din, organised by Andrew Igoe, which added a further reflective dimension to this important week. He was a teenager under the Khmer Rouge regime in the 1970s in Cambodia.

As a school community, we have been revisiting and streamlining our values. Staff and pupils have been extensively involved and consulted. These were shared with the Parent Council last week. I am keen to share them with you all and gather any feedback. Work is almost complete on relaunching our school website, and these values will sit at the heart of this.

- 2. Inclusive We commit to equity, belonging, and unity, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to thrive and contribute in meaningful ways.
- 3. Resilient We encourage perseverance, determination, and a growth mindset, empowering individuals to navigate challenges with confidence and optimism.

Leadership in S6
