<u>Mobile Phones</u> – please see the reminder that has been shared all week with our pupils regarding our mobile phone policy. This is not a change in policy, but just a reminder about our current expectations. Pupils do not require a mobile phone when at school, except for medical reasons. We are currently organising card games and board games that any young people will be able to access during social times.

<u>Supporting Learning Through Our Mobile Phone Policy</u> Thank you to everyone who follows our mobile phone expectations. By adhering to this policy, you're ensuring that you make the most of every learning opportunity at school. Please remember that you do not need to bring your mobile phone to school unless it is required for medical reasons. Mobile phones are not necessary for learning. If you choose to bring your phone, it should be switched off or on silent and kept in your bag during all learning times. This policy begins at 8:32 during registration and applies while moving between classes as well as when you are in class.

Our school values of respect, resilience, and inclusion are at the heart of this policy. Respect your learning environment, yourself, and your peers by minimising distractions. Show resilience by focusing on your studies and making the most of every lesson. Embrace inclusion by supporting one another and ensuring that everyone has the best possible learning experience.
