Resilient – We encourage perseverance, determination, and a growth mindset, empowering individuals to navigate challenges with confidence and optimism.



The Support for Learning Department aims to develop and support a pupil's learning wherever a need is encountered or any barrier to learning is identified.

Support for Learning





Teaching

- Teaching and teamteaching classes.
- Plan, deliver and monitor specialised/focused literacy and numeracy programmes and interventions.



Identification and Assessment

- Collaborate with colleagues to ensure early identification of pupils with additional support needs.
- Collate and disseminate information about pupils with an ASN.



Partnership Working

Partnership working is important to ensure a holistic approach is adopted in meeting the needs of our young people.



Consultation

Consultation takes many forms, from giving advice on teaching and learning strategies and resources to working collaboratively with individuals and departments.



Supporting Career Long Professional Learning

We contribute to CLPL by sharing experience and resources, giving advice on effective strategies to support learners, and disseminating information on relevant policies and legislation.





Pathway 1 – Majority of needs of pupils met in classroom by teacher.

The majority of homework for Modern Languages in S1 is vocabulary learning and revision.

The key to success is building the habit of practising at home regularly and in short, manageable amounts of time, as repetition of vocabulary is what helps us to remember it. All the key vocabulary for will be accessible in a variety of formats and pupils will be able to find vocabulary lists/booklets on Teams.

Pupils will get a login for www.languagenut.com (and can download the app for their ipads).

This allows pupils to choose which vocabulary they would like to practise, as well as letting us set specific tasks for them to do.

Little and often is the key!





All pupils will learn a variety of instruments in their weekly class music lesson. These include keyboard, guitar, bass, ukulele, drum-kit and xylophone



All S1 pupils will have the opportunity to audition on one of the following instruments:

Guitar, Double Bass/Bass Guitar,
Brass, Cello....if they are unsuccessful,
they will be put on a waiting list

If your young person has received lessons in an instrument at primary school, they will be contacted by the new teacher to find out if they want to continue with lessons





- Many Class Resources can be viewed in the Files area or Class Notebook




How to help your child



Ensure both Teams and Outlook app is installed (self-service app)


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
